15 YearsLet's Celebrate!

The Community Medical Clinic opened its doors in November, 1998. Located in the front offices of the United Way, 800 patients were seen in the first year by Alice Brooks, MD and Torill Nelson, RNP. There were 35 volunteers who kept the Clinic open six hours a week. The Community Medical Clinic of Kershaw County has come a long way.

Fast forward 15 years. We now have 1100 patients, 200 volunteers, six staff, and a new 4,000 square foot state of the art medical office. The Clinic has 4400 annual patient visits and is open 40 hours a week. This accomplishment is deserving of a GRAND EVENT, possibly in November.

Volunteer Training is Set for Friday, March 22, 2013

It is time for the annual training session. This means time for the OSHA component, fire department regulations, and updates on the electronic medical records program that was instituted at the Clinic in July. As we adjusted to this new system, many changes were necessary. The learning curve was absolutely vertical for a few months. For these reasons attendance is required for all volunteers, front desk, screeners, nursing, and pharmacy. Save the date, Friday March 22, 2013 from 9:00am – 12 noon at the Clinic. Annual Campaign in the Home Stretch with 15% To Go

This major fundraiser of the Clinic is chaired by Steve Van Horn and co-chaired by Mary Clark. With only \$25,000 to go, they urge Clinic supporters "to come forward and help move the campaign over the finish line".

The Community Medical Clinic has no federal or state funding and depends entirely on local donors and foundations. With 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ million dollars of medicine a year from pharmaceutical companies and the help of 200 volunteers, a one dollar donation provides \$12.50 in medical care at the Clinic. All donations are tax deductible and most appreciated.

The Annual Campaign was kicked off on December 1, 2012. It raises funds to provide medical care and medications for the Clinic's 1100 patients, who are uninsured residents of Kershaw County.
